Lobster season is in full swing! If you're heading out to catch some bugs, remember the following:


- Never dive alone! When free diving, one person should stay on the surface while the other dives
- Don't dive in areas you're unfamiliar with
- If boating at night, make sure you have working navigational lights, and watch the water closely for other divers while under way
- · Make sure you have your spiny lobster report card and follow the Dept. of Fish & Wildlife regulations



SWIFTWATER **TRAINING**

Marine Safety personnel have been busy over the last few weeks with 2 recent CA State Fire Marshal swiftwater classes - River & Flood Rescue Technician and River & Flood Rescue Boat Technician - taught by RBO Fletcher and RBO Reinheimer.

These courses are each 40 hours, with class taking place in-city, as well as in Blythe, CA at the Palo Verde Diversion Dam. LIFEGUARD SPOTLIGHT: JAMES REINHEIMER

James Reinheimer - also known as JR - moved down to Long Beach from Modesto in 1986 to attend CSULB, and shortly after graduated the LBLG rookie academy in Spring of 1987. JR was in the Army from '88-'89, and then a member of the Army Reserves until '94. Throughout the 1990s, JR worked as an EMT Ride-a-Long and Deckhand, and was hired as a Marine Safety Officer in 2000. JR was promoted to Rescue Boat Operator in 2008, and currently works on Rescue Boat 1. JR has been an integral part of the division over the years as a Training Cadre Member, Dive Team Member, Swiftwater Coordinator, CA State Fire Marshal Instructor, as well as a previous LBLGA



President and Board Member. After taking his first Swiftwater Rescue Course in 1997, JR developed a respectful passion for the river and flood water environment. Over the years he has gained valuable knowledge and experience in a variety of rescue disciplines. Earlier this year, JR was recognized as the "Dick Miller Waterman of the Year" by the Aquatic Capital of America. JR is an excellent teacher and mentor, and has led a number of swiftwater and marine rescue trainings within the division and across the state. Outside of work, JR enjoys surfing, road tripping, and camping in his Sprinter van with his wife, Aida.
